The Troupe is an all volunteer organization. Except for a leased 8,000 square foot, well ventilated space located on the 14th floor at 263 West 38th Street, New York, New York, the Troupe has no other physical presence. The Troupe leases theatre and meeting spaces as necessary. It shall be the Troupe's policy to follow the safety policies and protocols of the CDC, New York City, and New York State, of the leased theatres, of the leased meeting spaces, in addition to those laid out in this document. The more conservative policies and protocols shall be followed.

UPDATED BHT SAFETY PROTOCOLS DATED: August 9, 2023

Please remember that the COVID-19 virus in its various forms is still very much in our environment. As a community, we have navigated our way to resume as much of our activities as possible. To do so, we will continue to keep the necessary protocols in place in order to ensure the health of our community.

We are maintaining the following baseline protocols for BHT members:

1. Vaccination: All members will be asked to have at least one booster to participate in <u>any</u> in person Blue Hill Troupe sponsored event (including committee meetings - leaders are expected to ensure this requirement is met.) If you have not done so already, please send proof of booster vaccination and a copy of a government issued photo ID to <u>COVID@bht.org</u>. We strongly encourage all members to get the bi-valent booster; this booster was made available in NYC in September 2022. As well, please be aware of the next generation of vaccines due to be released in the fall of 2023.

PLEASE NOTE, we acknowledge that certain individuals have been advised by their physician, for medical reasons, against getting the COVID Vaccine/Boosters. If these individuals wish to participate in person, please contact COVID@bht.org to receive an exemption and agree to follow certain safety precautions to be determined at time of request.

- 2. Mask wearing will be optional. If anyone should feel uncomfortable in any environment, we strongly encourage you to mask up.
- 3. COVID Testing: If you experienced any cold or flu-like symptoms (*even mild ones*) or have been exposed to someone who tested positive, <u>please stay home and take a COVID test</u>. If you do test positive, please isolate yourself for 5 days or until you are no longer experiencing symptoms and/or test negative; then continue to wear a mask until day 10. <u>Click here for CDC Guidance</u>.
- 4. Notification: Please continue to contact COVID@bht.org if you have tested positive for COVID or been exposed to someone you know who has tested positive for COVID.
