

Founded in 1924 in Blue Hill, Maine, the Blue Hill Troupe has a three-part mission: bring high-quality theatre performances to New York City audiences, raise money for New York City charities, and maybe, just maybe, have a little fun along the way. With all of the Troupe's net proceeds from ticket and advertising sales going to the charity partner, we have raised over nine million dollars (adjusted for inflation) over the years.

Troupe members, aged 21-90-something, donate our time and energy to put on two full theatrical productions a year, usually a Broadway musical-type show and a Gilbert & Sullivan comic opera. We also present a series of concerts each winter. And if you indulge in a post-rehearsal or work session beverage, you might possibly hear a hearty rendition of "Hail, Poetry," our theme song, from *The Pirates of Penzance*.

Although we do boast a number of professional theatre people in our ranks, most Troupe members make a living in other professions. But in our "spare" time, Troupers sing and act, design and build sets, create costumes and props, wire lighting and sound systems, edit and produce the program, sell tickets and usher. The quality of our productions is testimony to our dedication and love for the theatre (and each other).

The Blue Hill Troupe has twice performed at Carnegie Hall with the New York Pops, and we were featured for many years in the Metropolitan Museum concert series. We have also been profiled on CBS Sunday Morning and the MetroArts/Thirteen performance series.

The Blue Hill Troupe was named International Champion at the 22nd Annual International Gilbert & Sullivan Festival in Harrogate, England, and also earned awards for Best Director, Best Supporting Actor, Best Female Voice, and Best Animated Chorus, for our production of Gilbert & Sullivan's Patience.

Director's Note

Anything Goes opened in 1934 and has remained a staple of the musical theater pantry throughout the ensuing 90 years that bring us to today. But its history has been anything but smooth sailing. Indeed, it has been rewritten and reorganized in myriad ways, including right before its original opening night. I would venture to say that it is the show's very adaptability that has ensured its shelf life: The basic construct of an ocean voyage and general shenanigans set to Cole Porter's brilliant songs has remained, but certain plot elements were eschewed to comport with changing sensibilities and times, songs came and went, characters got new names... but there was always Cole Porter. And jokes. Yes, anything goes when it comes to getting a laugh or building a scene just to land a good — and often silly — punch line. And that's the essence of the show: its title.

Like our show, the Troupe, at 100 years old, is an ever-changing organization that has seen — and continues to see — countless revisions and adaptations while remaining absolutely true to its core mission of making the world a better place, one musical at a time. The storied and successful histories of both the Troupe and Anything Goes prove that you can have it both ways: deeply traditional and ever-changing.

So, I hope you enjoy the sparkling genius of Cole Porter land Messrs. Wodehouse, Lindsay, Crouse (both père et fils), and Weidman — see what I mean!) as presented by the heart and soul that is the Blue Hill Troupe.
